## DeSales University

Father Bernard O'Connor, the President of DeSales University, spoke at all the Masses last week and reviewed the history of his personal relationship with St. Mary Parish. He began to come to say Mass here in 1972, just after he was ordained a priest. He said the last two Sunday Masses, in the parish hall. The original church had burned down and the new one was not built until 1984.

In 1985, Bishop McShea of Allentown diocese asked his community of priests, who teach in North Catholic and Father Judge High Schools, to open a Catholic college. The five other colleges in the area were protestant based. They did, Allentown College.

It is now named DeSales University and has excellent academic programs, notably their Physician's Assistants, which is top rated in the country. Father O'Connor also emphasized his gathering with other Catholic university presidents with Pope Benedict and how the Catholic tradition at DeSales is very much in harmony with the ideals the Pope reviewed.

His appeal for prayers and funds is an annual one. For decades, St. Mary people have generously supported them.

**BLESSED RAFAELA IBARRA**  
**Born January 16, 1843**  
**Died February 23, 1900**  
**Beatified September 30, 1984**

A daughter was born to a wealthy but devout Basque couple on January 16, 1843, in Bilbao, Spain. The following day she received in Baptism the name Rafaela Maria Stefania and from then on grew to be a shining example among the saints of the Basque people, as Pope John Paul II declared at the beatification on September 30, 1984. Even as a very small child, Rafaela showed extraordinary signs of piety. At the age of eleven, she received her First Holy communion, which made a truly profound impression upon her, for on that occasion, as she noted in her diary, she wept for joy over the experience of encountering Christ.

If you think little Rafaela grew up to be a nun, you are wrong. She wanted to demonstrate, in a genuinely Christian marriage, that you can also love God fervently when you deliberately include Christ at the third party to the marriage covenant. At the age of 18, Rafaela married a young man from a wealthy Christian family, Jose Vilallonga, and together with him led a Christian married life in the best sense. She loved her husband in

God and for God's sake, and likewise her children and adopted nieces and nephews. She lovingly took in her aged parents and other relatives as well, not forgetting meanwhile to carry out apostolic work in a wider circle. In the true spirit of the apostolate, she used her great wealth to establish Holy Family Hospice in Bilbao for women in difficult straits and girls at risk. To care for such girls she also founded a religious congregation, the Sisters of the Holy Guardian Angels.

Under the spiritual direction of the Jesuit priest Francisco de Sales Muruzabel and with her husband's approval, Senora Rafaela took vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, to which she added in 1890 the vow of always preferring which is most pleasing to God, which would include, as soon as her family situation permitted, consecrating herself completely to God as a religious.

## From the Pastor

Sell everything to buy the treasure. Life with God points in that direction. Two parables tell us to think of the Kingdom as something which is worth a whole change of financial plans. Everything? Yes, it is so valuable that the only way is to sell all that you have for it.

For example, in quite a few cases, a Protestant minister gave up his church and livelihood, and indeed a large number of friendships to become a Catholic. Marcus Grodi is one. His book, *Journeys Home*, tells his own story as well as a dozen others who became Catholic. Actually, the book is not a complaint about loss, but – as the parable indicates – a celebration of the happiness and love they all found in joining the Catholic Church.

It still is worth pointing out, however, that it did include the pain and suffering of the loss of security and of friends. The author also has a TV show, *Journeys Home*, at 8:00 pm on Mondays on EWTN. He interviews men and women who have become Catholics. Their stories are many and varied, and although some have found their faith without suffering much loss, the majority have left people and good situations behind. What they found was much better. Just listening to their stories is uplifting and a source of deep satisfaction.

We love our faith. We may not have ever had to make a decision this important, to leave something or someone we have loved in favor of something or someone we have come to realize will be better. However, we have made decisions to sacrifice some good for greater. Although these remarks may have some connections with marriage, please do not take them to mean divorce for another person. No, in the cases of seeing a possibly better spouse, the real choice is to find ways to enrich your own marriage by knowing and loving your spouse better. Find the treasure in newly discovered good qualities and talents in him or her. Then enrich both by going for developing those qualities and talents.

No, we are challenged to see what good (or not so good) situations in our own lives could be replaced by something far better. For example, getting to know Jesus better.

Can we agree that knowing Jesus Christ better will

most likely lead to loving Him more? So it is reasonable to ask what this will cost us. Your fellow parishioners can give you some motivation. Hundreds come each week to adore Him in the Eucharist in our chapel. There they read from the Bible about Him, and from books about Him and about prayer to Him. They simply look at Him and converse with Him. Others find good Catholic websites and good TV programs (though most of these are on EWTN, the Eternal Word Television Network, and even if your cable provider does not contain it in the standard package, you can still download it and watch and listen over the internet).

The point here is that it will take a decision to set aside some time and perhaps get some materials or even talk to someone about Jesus.

He is the one throwing the party in heaven.

To enjoy or even to get into the heavenly banquet, we will pay a price. It is not like the rich man, who because of his goodness, the Lord granted his request to bring two suitcases with him into heaven. When St. Peter, after receiving the Lord's OK, asked him to open the suitcases, he saw that they were filled with bars of gold, and said to the guy "You brought road building blocks?"

No the price is love, self giving love. The Lord chose to give His life on the Cross. You can read all about that in the Gospels. He made us in such a way that when we give of ourselves, not only are the people we do good things for better for it, but we also are better too. Healthier, having the satisfaction of our making someone happier, we are more peaceful. This is a true win-win s: *Fr. Mc Elroy*
