WHAT IS THE JUNIOR LEGION OF MARY?

The Legion of Mary is the largest apostolic organization of lay people in the Catholic Church, with well over 3 million active members. It has been approved by the last 6 Popes, and was endorsed by the Second Vatican Council. The main purpose of the Junior Legion of Mary is to give glory to God through the sanctification of its members and preparation of its members to enter the Senior Legion.

WHAT DOES THE JUNIOR LEGION OF MARY DO?

Members become instruments of the Holy Spirit through a balanced program of prayer and works. Works include door-to-door evangelization, parishioner visitation, praying and visiting with nursing home residents and homebound, religious education assisting PREP teachers, visiting the newly baptized, Pilgrim Virgin Statue rotations, participation in community events, hosting rosary and card making workshops and meeting the other spiritual needs of the parish community. Legionaries are under the guidance of a spiritual director.
